III. The Life of Robert Chambers

Robert Chambers (1802-1871): Scottish publisher, poet, journalist, encyclopedist, and anonymous author of the most widely read book on the topic of evolution (*Vestiges of the Natural History of Creation*) between Lamarck's *Philosophie Zoologique* (1809) and Darwin's *Origin of Species* (1859). Chambers will be the focus of the spring semester reading group which will explore the historical context within which Charles Darwin began his analysis of the process of evolution.



Readings will include:

Just Before Darwin (1959, Milton Millhauser - a biography of Chambers and analysis of Vestiges of the Natural History of Creation)

Victorian Sensation (2000, James A. Secord - an historical analysis of the publication of *Vestiges of the Natural History of Creation*)

Vestiges of the Natural History of Creation (1844) and Explanations: a Sequel to Vestiges of the Natural History of Creation (1845)

Critiques of Vestiges by Thomas Huxley, Adam Sedgwick, Hugh Miller, Charles Darwin and others

Students, postdoctorals, and faculty are welcome. The reading group will meet monthly, in the evening, on the following dates: January 18 (Saturday), February 16 (Sunday), March 18 (Tuesday), April 16 (Wednesday).
