OFFICE of COMMERCIAL COMMISSIONERS. A FALSE impression having pervaded the Public L mind that there is a right to deduct from estimated

Income, the subole of the triple Assessments paid last year: The Commercial Commissioners feel it their duty to guard the Public against so erroneous a principle, as the undermentioned Taxes only can be deducted, viz. the Land Tax, when paid by the Ononer, and the annual Taxes on Houses. Windows, Carriages, Horses, Male Servants, and Dogs, and that no parochial Taxes come under the head of Deductions.
